There are many areas of interest available at the 40th NCCS Biennial Conference being held in Louisville, Kentucky on April 1-5, 2008 that will appeal to spouses of members attending:

- On Wednesday, April 2, there will be a grand trip to some of Louisville's treasures. Leaving at 9:30AM from the hotel you will visit the famed Speed Art Museum for a tour of over 12,000 pieces of incredible art in the permanent exhibit and 2 special shows, "The Architecture of the Quilt," and "The Medieval and Renaissance Treasures from the Victoria and Albert Museum." <http://www.speedmuseum.org> Following that, we will visit and have lunch at legendary Churchill Downs and tour the track and museum and view the cyclotron theater for a Derby Day presentation. This has been the home of the famed "Kentucky Derby" since 1875. <http://www.churchilldowns.com> Transportation, lunch and all admission charges will be \$30.00 for each person.
- On Thursday, April 3, we will visit and tour the world famous Hillerich and Bradsby plant and museum to see where and how the "Louisville Slugger" is made and the wonderful baseball museum and shows. You may even want to buy your own bat with YOUR signature burned into it. <http://www.slugger.com> After lunch, a visit to a special museum just across the street called the Frazier International History Museum, one of the most unusual showcases you will ever see. <http://www.frazierarmsmuseum.org> Transportation, lunch and all admission charges will be \$30.00 per person.
- On Friday, April 4, there will be a trip to the two largest shopping malls in Kentucky. There are a plethora of national and local stores for your perusal. We will leave the hotel at 9:30 and return at 2:30. The malls are only a quarter of a mile apart so we will be providing shuttle service between them. Bring your own money to shop. There is no charge to registered NCCS attendees for this trip!! Lunch is on your own at the food courts or restaurants.
